Outdoor Skating

Our outdoor skating season is off to a great start!

Free outdoor skating is available for community league members with a current membership. Please wear your RED skate tags. CLCL memberships are available on site... just ask our rink attendants, if you need to renew yours. Washroom facilities and change room are available. Our rink, by the community hall and Lymburn School, is open the following hours:

Monday to Friday: 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm

Saturday & Sunday: noon to 7:00 pm

Rink availability and hours of operation are subject to change due to private rentals, weather, or ice conditions. You can check the current Open/Closed status of the rink on our website (under the Community Calendar).

For ice rental questions, please contact Lisa Madsen at 780-444-0235 or madsen@telusplanet.net.

The rink will be closed when temperatures are below -20C (including windchill) or above +3C.

Please observe the following rink rules, also posted at the hall.

- The rink is open for general public shinny hockey AND recreational skating.
- For safety reasons, approved skating helmets must be worn by all skaters under 18 years of age.
- Children 6 years and under must be supervised by an individual 14 years or older.
- Skating in a manner that endangers or interferes with other skater's safety or pleasure is strictly forbidden.
- No fighting, pushing, checking, foul language, smoking, spitting or high sticking. Users should encourage good sportsmanship.
- Alcohol and drugs are not permitted on the premises.
- Pets are not allowed.
- Skate tags must be visible at all times.
- Rink Attendant/Supervisor's Word is Final.

The Callingwood-Lymburn Community Playschool (CLCP) is a non-profit parent co-operative program offered by the Callingwood-Lymburn Community League. We are located within Lymburn Elementary School at 18710 – 72nd Avenue, are licensed by the Province of Alberta, and as part of the community league are incorporated under the Societies Act of Alberta.

We will soon be accepting registrations for our 3 & 4 year old playschool program for 2019/2020. Registration for current and alumni families started in January.

Registration for the 2019/2020 school year:

- February 20 - Open House in the classroom from 6:00 - 7:30 pm. We will be accepting completed registration forms for new families at the open house.

A complete registration must include ALL necessary forms of payment attached to the registration form. Only complete registrations will secure your child's spot on the class list. Be sure to read our handbook and make sure you fill out the registration package (available on our website) for the 2019/2020 school year.

Our school has adopted the Learn Thru Play philosophy, believing that helping children to use their imagination fosters wonderful daily opportunities for learning. The purpose of the playschool is to provide enriching pre-school experiences for children from the ages of 3 to 4 years old. As we are a parent co-operative playschool, all parents participate in our school's operations by assisting in classroom activities. Parents can also participate on the committee which oversees the running of the program.

Children who are turning 3 between September and October 31 can participate in our 3 year old program! The child must be potty trained, and must attend with their parent/guardian until the child turns 3 years of age.
